ARTICLE 4(1) DIRECTION COVERING BOUGHTON RISE (ALSO KNOWN AS THE JALNA ESTATE), BOUGHTON, DAVENTRY, NORTHAMPTONSHIRE

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (GENERAL DEVELOPMENT) ORDER 1995 AS AMENDED

DIRECTION MADE UNDER ARTICLE 4(1) TO WHICH ARTICLE 5 APPLIES

WHEREAS DAVENTRY DISTRICT COUNCIL (lithe Council") being the appropriate local planning authority within the meaning of Article 4(4) of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 as amended (lithe 1995 Order"), is satisfied that it is expedient that development of the description set out in the Schedule below should not be carried out on the land edged red on the attached plan (lithe Land") unless planning permission is granted on an application made under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended.

NOW THEREFORE the Council in pursuance of the power conferred on them by Article 4(1) of the 1995 Order hereby direct that the permission granted by Article 3 of the 1995 Order shall not apply to development on the Land of the description set out in the Schedule below:

SCHEDULE


A change of use of a building to a use falling within Class C4 (houses in multiple occupation) of the Schedule to the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) Order 1987 as amended ("the Use Classes Order") from a use falling within Class C3 (dwellinghouses) of the Schedule to the Use Classes Order, being development comprised within Class I of Part 3 of Schedule 2 to the 1995 Order and not being development comprised within any other Class.

The Article 4 Direction will come into force on [01.09.2012]

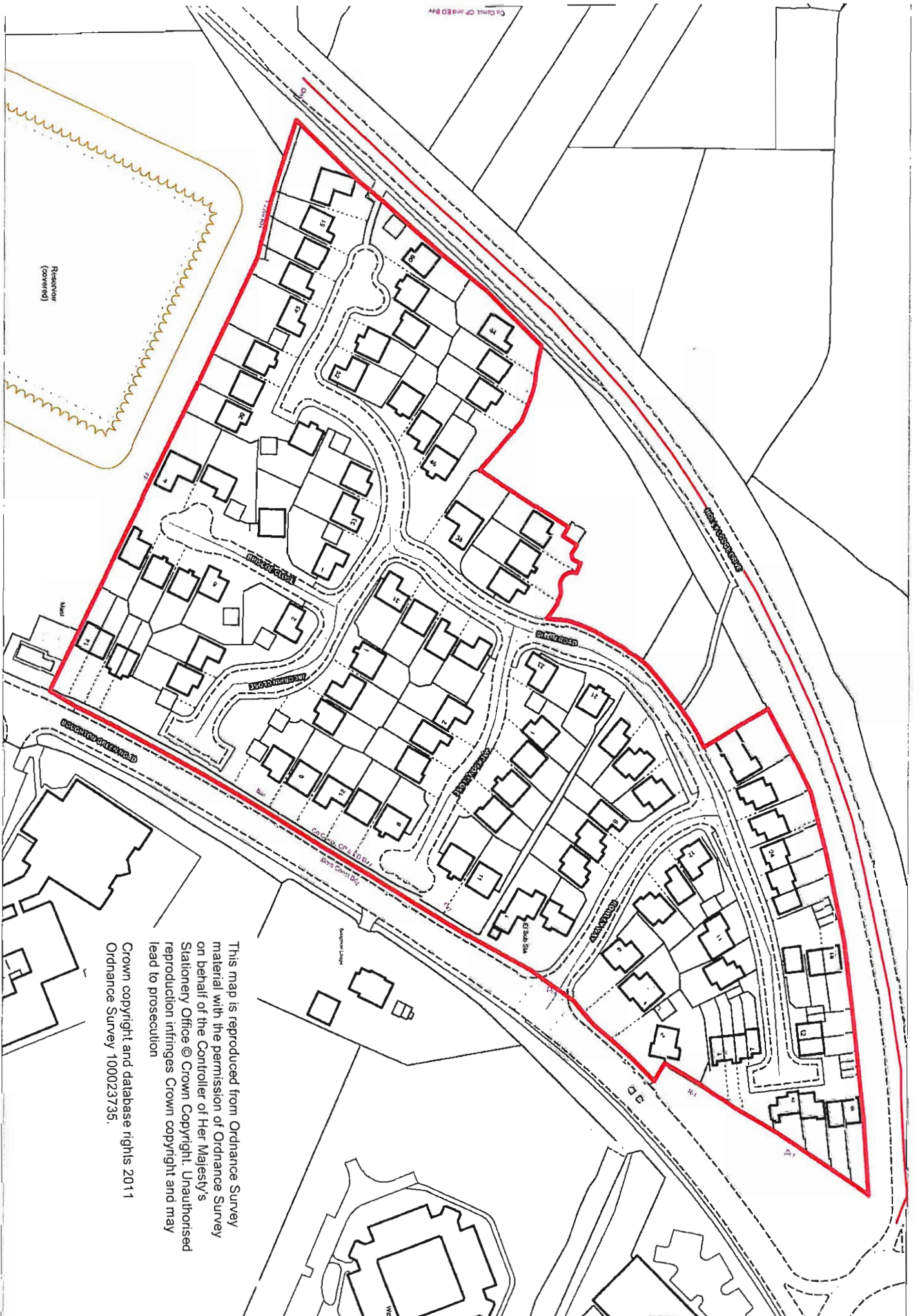
